The Biblical View of Salvation by Grace

(Part 3)

Please notice that the Bible speaks of many kinds of works:

- 1) Works of the devil (John 8:44; I John 3:8);
- 2) Wicked works of the flesh (Romans 8:13; Galatians 5:19-21; Colossians 1:21);
- 3) Works of human merit, like saving a baby from a burning building (II Timothy 1:9);
- 4) Works of the Law of Moses (Galatians 2:16); and
- 5) Works of faith, or works of godly righteousness in obedience to God's New Testament commands (Acts 2:37-40; 10:34-35, 48; Galatians 5:6; I Thessalonians 1:3; I John 3:7).

If works have nothing to do with whether or not one enters Heaven, why does God repeatedly say that all men will be judged by their works? (Ecclesiastes 12:14; Matthew 7:21-23; 12:36; 16:27; 25:30; John 5:28-29; Romans 2:5-6; II Corinthians 5:10; 11:15; I Peter 1:17; Revelation 20:12-13; 22:12; cf. Psalm 62:12; Proverbs 24:12; Jeremiah 17:10; 21:14). As will be shown, interpreting Ephesians 2:8-9 in a way that rules out all works as having any part in one's salvation conflicts with the context and contradicts a multitude of other inspired passages. Paul was not saying that no works have a part in man's salvation. Jesus even said that belief is a work! (John 6:29). Jesus called belief a work, because having obedient faith in Jesus is one of the things commanded by God that men must do, and Jesus was trying to change the mindset of the Jews (compare many of Paul's writings).

Notice Ephesians 2:8-9 in its context of Jews and Gentiles both being saved apart from the works of the Law of Moses, which God describes as "the enmity" that has been "slain":

For by **grace** are ye saved through **faith**; and that not of yourselves: it is the gift of God: Not of works, lest any man should boast These four key words are found in other passages related to the Law of Moses, JPH]. For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus unto good works [Not all works are bad!, JPH], which God hath before ordained that we should walk in them. Wherefore remember, that ye being in time past **Gentiles** in the flesh, who are called Uncircumcision by that which is called the Circumcision [He is speaking of Jews and Gentiles, because the "works" above are works of the Law of Moses, JPH] in the flesh made by hands; That at that time ye were without Christ, being aliens from the commonwealth of Israel, and strangers from the covenants of promise, having no hope, and without God in the world: But now in Christ Jesus [Being "baptized into Christ" (Galatians 3:26-27; cf. Acts 19:1-5) is described as working righteousness to be accepted by God—Acts 10:34-35, 48, JPH] ye who sometimes were far off are made nigh by the blood of Christ. For he is our peace, who hath made both one, and hath broken down the middle wall of partition between us; Having abolished in his flesh the enmity, even the law of commandments contained in ordinances; for to make in himself of twain one new man, so making peace; And that he might reconcile both unto God in one body by the cross, having **slain the enmity** thereby (Ephesians 2:8-16, emphasis JPH).

Will anyone really argue that Ephesians 2:8-9 is not in the context of the Law of Moses being abolished? Works of the Law of Moses have nothing to do with man's salvation under the New Covenant (Ephesians 2:9).

Regarding boasting when it comes to deserving salvation (2:8-9), this prideful attitude is seen exclusively among Jews in the New Testament Scriptures. Jews, who were proud to be called God's chosen people, carrying out the works of the Law of Moses, "trusted in themselves that they were righteous, and despised others" (Luke 18:8), and were much more likely to boast of their righteousness than Gentiles. Consider the prideful attitude of the "children of Abraham" in John 8:33-59, or the praying Pharisee boasting to God of his righteousness (Luke 18:9-14). Passages such as Galatians 2:11-21, Romans 2:17-23, Romans 3:27, and Romans 11:18 also show a pride and boastfulness which was characteristic of many Jews, whose confidence was in the Law of Moses—not obedient faith in Christ (Romans 10:1-3, 16). This is further evidence that what the Holy Spirit had in mind in Ephesians 2:8-9 was boasting regarding works of the Law of Moses.
